

Artist Statement

SERENDIPITY / ser'ən-dip'-i-tē / noun. "The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way."

Serendipity is a favorite word that describes my feelings about life and art. My art is a reflection of the role serendipity plays in my work. An intaglio plate is a creative vehicle to present one's artistic imagination on a two-dimensional surface, sometimes making the most of serendipitous accidents ultimately revealed in the final print. The resulting printed work provokes a sense of playfulness through the use of vivid and bright colors.

I have always enjoyed learning and sharing what I have learned with others, and think teaching is like planting seeds. I invite students to think, and to consider new things and the possibility of embracing change.
