Student Drop/Withdrawal Policy

You will receive full Drawing Studio credit or a refund if a class is cancelled, or if you withdraw two or more weeks in advance of the class start date. Students withdrawing between two weeks and 24 hours of the class start date may request a 50% refund or full Drawing Studio credit. No refund or credit will be given once a class begins. Class credits are valid for 1 year.

Class Cancellation Policy

Classes may be cancelled 72 hours before the first class if it does not meet the minimum enrollment. If this happens, we will issue a full refund or Drawing Studio credit. All refunds are sent via check to the student's address on file. Please allow up to 14 business days for your refund.

Free classes through libraries

The Pima County Public Library System has expanded

our contract to teach art classes through its branch libraries. This

Drawing Fundamentals

THE FOUNDATIONAL COURSE SEQUENCE OF THE DRAWING STUDIO

Both universal and intimate, drawing is the backbone of visual art. Since our earliest days, drawing has been a powerful tool to explore what it is to be alive and human.

Anyone CAN learn to draw. And, like any skill worth acquiring, drawing is an ongoing discipline that continually presents challenges. Drawing Fundamentals provides a supportive and encouraging learning environment that immerses you in the practice of drawing from observation. Guided by experienced teaching artists and inspired by your peers, you will see the world in new ways, persist through difficulty, and expand your creative expression in art and in life.

Drawing Fundamentals is structured as a sequence of two 6-week courses—Drawing Fundamentals 1 and 2-followed by a wide range of 3-week drawing practice modules from which you can pick and choose. These courses introduce a curriculum of foundational skills that progressively deepens your practice. The sequence is designed for beginners with no experience as well as those with an art background who want to revisit and expand their practice. We offer multiple sections of each course at various times and locations throughout the year.

Drawing is a means to other artistic ends as well as its own rich domain. Whatever your goal or intention, Drawing Fundamentals will initiate you into a practice that can serve you for a lifetime.

Drawing Fundamentals, Level 1

In DF1, students learn four foundational drawing skills: shape/edge, measurement, light (value) and space (perspective). You will begin to combine these skills into drawings that will surprise you by their accomplishment and banish any fears regarding your ability to observe and draw.

Fee: \$195 (6 sessions) Students who have paid the full tuition and completed level 1 may repeat level 1 at half price. Please call to register and apply this discount.

Begin to develop a personal vision that expands your experience of "observation" to encompass both internal and external realms.

SECTION A: 9AM-12PM : MARCY ELLIS

Artists will experience a jam packed and fun week exploring mixed media techniques and projects. Drawing, painting, printmaking, and introduction to collage will all be part of the process.

SECTION B: 1PM-4PM : JENNIFER ESCHEDOR

Students will experiment with a variety of materials and create an awesome nature journal filled with their artwork! Young artists will learn basic bookmaking techniques as well as metal embossing and printmaking.

WEEK 2: JUNE 17-21

Artists will explore mixed media techniques to create 3-D works of art. Students will discover how to create mini sculptures using materials like papier-mâché, clay, plaster, and wire. Some technical drawing and painting skills will be used to complete amazing works of art.

Teen Immersion Camp Ages 13–17

This camp is a 2-week long, intensive program. Extended sessions allow students to learn fundamental skills of working from direct observation and to explore their imaginative and deeply original takes on the world. Students will work in a variety of media including graphite, charcoal, ink, pastel, watercolor, acrylic paint, and more. Each week features different media, projects, and teaching artists.

WEEK 1: GINA BECA, SHAUNA MCGLAMERY

During this week, students will investigate the concept of identity in artwork through watercolor, ink, graphite, plaster, and mixed media. Drawing, watercolor, and sculptural techniques will be explored in greater depth to create projects that highlight each student's individuality.

WEEK 2: SHANTAYE MCMORROW, HEIDI UDOVICH

This week will include mixed media projects as well as hyper-realistic drawing and painting. Students will work to develop drawing and painting techniques to create landscapes, portraits, etc. Acrylic paint, mixed media, found objects, and other exciting materials will be used to create both large and small works of art.
